



Tertiary Pathways

A Frensham education prepares students for success in tertiary studies and careers beyond school, with an emphasis on lifelong learning. It provides a values framework that encourages students to develop their talents and to make a contribution to the world. Students are assisted with their applications for tertiary entrance and scholarships, both in Australia and overseas. With each student's special interests and aspirations well understood by staff and supported by professional careers advice, every student leaves Frensham with a tertiary pathway well defined and accessible.

Each year, the graduating class receives a wide range of tertiary offers, including offers to study interstate and overseas. Many past students have successfully enrolled in universities in Victoria, South Australia, Queensland and Western Australia. Students are regularly offered bachelor degree courses at a range of universities. For the 2014 cohort, for example, there were 40 different courses offered to a class of 50 students. Among the tertiary institutions offering courses to Frensham students were Australian National University, University of New England, Charles Sturt University, University of New South Wales, University of Wollongong, University of Sydney, University of Technology, University of Canberra, London College of Fashion, National Art School and Victorian College of the Arts.

The types of courses offered included flexible double degrees in the fields of Law, Arts, Science, Social Sciences and Business, together with Bachelor degrees in the following courses: Agriculture; Applied Science; Biomedical Engineering; Business (Media and Communications); Commerce (Media, Arts and Production); Commerce and International Studies; Criminology; Engineering; Fine Arts; Forensic Science; Human Nutrition; International and Global Studies; Liberal Arts and Science; Nursing; Political, Economic and Social Sciences; Primary Education; Property Economics; Rural Science; Science; Science (Psychology); Science in Agriculture; Science/Arts; Screenwriting; and Visual Arts.

In 2015 Annabelle was awarded Medal of the Order of Australia for 'Service to the International Community'.

Together with co-founder in her School for Life Foundation, Dave Everett, Annabelle has built Katuuso Primary and Vocational School in Uganda to provide Preschool and Primary schooling for 300 children, vocational training in agriculture, tailoring and literacy for 100 adults and healthcare for the entire community.

Annabelle completed Year 12 at Frensham with distinction in all respects, and went on to complete a double degree Bachelor of Arts/Law at the University of Sydney whilst undertaking her ambitious project in Uganda. She is a regular visitor to Frensham and has presented annually at the Year 9 Global Forum. Annabelle has now been named a finalist in the NSW Woman of the Year Awards.
